Homework Club is available for pupils from third, fourth, fifth and sixth class pupils from 3 to 4 pm on Mondays and Tuesdays. This club is run by school staff. Food is provided. This is a great opportunity for children to have their homework completed in a quiet, supervised environment where support is available.
